What does the Special Needs Room look like on Wednesday evening?

The Special Needs Room is open from 6-8 PM. This is a great time for you to enjoy a Bible study or come to the support group for parents of special needs children which meets from 6-7 PM. Contact Deb Manning for more information on the support group.

What is “respite”?

Respite is a monthly time set aside for parents to drop off their special needs children for a few hours so they can have a break. Respite is typically one Saturday a month from 9-Noon. Occasionally a Friday evening will be available. Respite is held in the Special Needs Room. To sign up for respite or get further information and a schedule, contact Deb Manning.

Is the Special Needs Room open during special events held by the church?

Yes, most special events held by the church will include opportunities for your special needs child.

How do I get my special needs adult involved in Taking Aim on Sundays?
